

Target population

Parents & carers of children with sexualised, problematic or harmful sexual behaviours.

Professionals working with children with sexualised, problematic or harmful sexual behaviours.

Mode and context of delivery

A booklet which is educational, informative and advice giving.

Helping Children with Sexual Behaviour Problems is a 44 page, easy-to-digest, booklet.

Description of book

The author of the booklet is a chartered Clinical Psychologist, working in the USA. The booklet provides an easilyaccessible model which carers and professionals can access to help children decrease their problematic sexual behaviours.

The author's website states that the booklet provides advice and guidance around the following topic areas:

- what everyone helping children with sexual behavior helping problems should know
- modifying children's problematic sexual behaviors, preparing the home environment, providing a healthy sexual environment, encouraging healthy boundaries, guidelines for healthy boundaries, making the home feel safe for all of the children, clarity regarding acceptable behaviors
- working together to decrease the child's problematic sexual behavior, developing a plan to decrease one
 problematic sexual behavior at a time, playing detective (what triggers the selected problematic sexual
 behavior?), working out the fine details of the plan between the caregiver and the child and implementing
 it and carefully reviewing the plan post implementation
- masturbation
- parenting the child's sexual behaviour problems for example, talking about sex, listening and responding to the child and caregivers providing patience and compassion
- assessment and treatment of children with sexual behaviour problems and their families, including goal setting and both individual and group therapy
- cooperation and communication between all team members, including working with the school/daycare, after schools programmes, the criminal justice system and probation
